What's OPT?

OPT is a temporary employment authorization for international students who have completed their degree program in the U.S. It allows them to gain practical work experience in their field of study. OPT is available to students who are currently in the U.S. on an F-1 visa. The authorization is granted for a maximum of 90 days per employer and a total of 12 months per student. How long can a student work on OPT?

12 months. For students in STEM fields, it can be extended to 36 months. OPT is available to students who are currently in the U.S. on an F-1 visa. The authorization is granted for a maximum of 90 days per employer and a total of 12 months per student.

What happens after OPT ends for a student?

After OPT ends, a student must either find a job that sponsors them for an H-1B visa, return to their home country, or re-enter the U.S. as a student. OPT is available to students who are currently in the U.S. on an F-1 visa. The authorization is granted for a maximum of 90 days per employer and a total of 12 months per student.
